
Where Your Money Goes:

In Honor Of Riley Saper



Riley was a straight-A student who loved baseball, reading, and his friends. On January 5, 2010, Riley was diagnosed with Acute Myeloid Leukemia (AML). He spent the next two months in treatment at Maria Fareri Children's Hospital and then the remainder of his treatment at Memorial Sloan Kettering (MSK). During this time, Riley completed his seventh-grade studies, including state exams. But during this time, Riley suffered dearly. Shortly after his 13th birthday on April 22, we had a discussion with the team of doctors, and despite their advice that a bone marrow transplant would offer little hope (his sister was a perfect match), we insisted that we move forward with the transplant. The doctors gave Riley a 17% chance of survival. I said that I would do anything even if there was less than 1% of survival. On June 11, 2010, at 8:00 PM, Riley passed away. I held his hand as he took his last breath. During this time, I spent days and nights with Riley, watched him suffer, and be reduced from that shining, strong, bright man to a boy who barely had the strength to get out of bed. Honoring his love of the New York Yankees, Riley is buried in a Yankee jersey.

Honored Kicker and LLS Visionary Of The Year Candidate: Jeff Saper



During the late winter of 2018, my wife, Shannon, and I were running the New York City Half Marathon. About halfway through, I looked at her and said that I had so little energy. I could barely move. Strange, as I had run marathons, half marathons, and triathlons. We did finish that race, but something was not right. During that Spring, I experienced unusual physical symptoms that led me to a doctor for tests. On July 3, 2018, I was diagnosed with Hairy Cell Leukemia (HCL). HCL is a rare disease impacting less than 1,000 people annually in the US. I was fortunate to be part of a successful trial program at MSK, and am now cancer free.

Since Riley's passing and following my treatment (by the way, one of my daughters is a cancer survivor, too!) I committed to doing all that I can to end blood cancers. I do not want any parent to feel the pain that I continue to feel. I do not want any child to suffer as Riley had suffered. I can empathize, as I went through chemotherapy, too, and understand the feeling of toxic drugs flowing through the body. Treatment for pediatric cancers, especially AML, had followed the same toxic protocols used for decades. I advocate for LLS to ensure that patients and families get fair access to therapies and better choices with their insurance. I will work tirelessly to ensure treatments use modern therapies and kids suffer less and have greater chances of survival. No one needs to suffer any longer.


